2. Direction for Tax Rate Bylaw 1065/19

Council discussed the financial report presented by R. Serhan. There is a delay in presenting the complete tax rate bylaw due to the province's delayed statement of intent for the provincial school requisition for 2019 because of the 2019 election.

The Province has stated that 'municipalities may choose to estimate a 2019 education property tax requisition or may wish to delay setting a property tax bylaw until further information is available. An estimate can be done using 2017 equalized assessment data and the 2018 uniform education tax rates or using the 2018 Education Property Tax requisition amount. Alternatively, municipalities may wish to wait to set their local education property tax rates once the provincial budget is tabled.'

A 0% increase in the municipal tax rate would leave the County in a deficit position of \$434,331 alternatively, a 1% overall tax rate increase would leave the County in a surplus position of \$35,826.

3. Auditors' Report, Metrix Group LLP - Draft 2018 Financial Statements

- R. Serhan presented an overview of the Clearwater County Consolidated Statement of Financial Position for the year ending on December 31, 2018 and explained budget variances.
- R. Serhan introduced Phil Dirks, Chartered Accountant and Partner at Metrix Group LLP.

P. Dirks provided background information on the 2018 audit process and noted auditor duties and responsibilities.

He stated that the County remains in good financial condition with low debt, healthy reserves, average to low taxes, and comparable spending. He noted that there are no significant control deficiencies, no unusual accounting policies or estimates, no material uncorrected misstatements, and no difficulties were encountered during the audit.

- P. Dirks stated that the 2018 audit went well and thanked staff for their assistance and well managed records.
- M. Hagan noted that the reserve transfers discussed earlier in the meeting, and approved by Council, have been reflected in the statements and that minor changes will take place with respect to the tax revenue budget and schedule 2.
